Dear Members and Partners,

As I announced in our January newsletter, the international "4 per 1000" Initiative is celebrating its tenth anniversary this year. Bearing in mind that neither the situation of our planet, nor that of Humanity, is cause for celebration, we are keen to mark this first decade with specific work by the Executive Secretariat, to illustrate through results and achievements, these first ten years of our initiative.

To this end, the entire team has mobilized to prepare a summary of our joint work, a first glimpse of which will be shared at the event we are organizing as part of the ChangeNOW Summit in Paris on April 24. The event will feature two round tables, one on the theme of taking stock, and the other on prospects for the next decade. We'll have the opportunity to hear from some of the personalities who have left their mark on the Initiative, and their

perceptions of the directions it should take in the future. If you are in Paris on April 24 in the late afternoon, do not hesitate to come to the Grand Palais for this highlight, but don't forget to register in advance (see more information in this newsletter, page 3).

The year 2025 will also see the first regional meeting of the Initiative for Latin America and the Caribbean, to be held in Rio de Janeiro (Brazil) from June 25 to 28, with a scientific connotation that will not let us forget to involve the players in the field. Thanks to the fantastic work of Dr Beata Madari, member of the Scientific and Technical Committee of the Initiative, and soil scientist at EMBRAPA, this conference will benefit from the contributions of numerous scientists and field players from Latin America and the Caribbean. It will be co-organized by EMBRAPA, UFG, CCarbone, the ILPF network, the Soil Carbon International Research Consortium (IRC) led by the OrCasa project and, of course, by the international "4 per 1000" Initiative. The Scientific Technical Committee will meet on June 23 and 24, and the members present will actively participate in the regional conference on behalf of both the international "4 per 1000" Initiative and the IRC.

We should be back in Brazil in Belém for COP 30 of the Climate Convention in November, and more specifically for the "4 per 1000" Day on November 19. I stress "we should", because for the time being, the level of the Executive Secretariat's financial resources does not allow us to say so. Unfortunately, I have often had to say that our finances are at a very low level, but this year, 2025, we can only look forward to the month of July, without too many worries, without being able to project ourselves beyond that. Join the "4 per 1000" Initiative in Berlin this fall!

Hosted by the German Federal Ministry for Food and Agriculture, the international "4 per 1000" Initiative is organizing the first conference on soil health and soil carbon sequestration in the temperate regions.

The conference, SoilCarbon4Climate, will take place in Berlin from September 11 to 13, 2025. It will bring together soil health experts from across the temperate climate zone, offering excellent opportunities for networking and knowledge exchange through presentations, discussions, workshops, as well as an excursion to partner farms of the German Humus Programme. Registration will open mid-April. Stay tuned!



2nd EU Carbon Farming Summit - 4-6 March 2025 - Dublin, Ireland

The first week of March saw the 2nd edition of the <u>European Carbon Farming Summit</u>, which took place in Dublin, Ireland.

During the three day conference, over 500 participants from sciences, politics, civil society, the farming community and the private sector, discussed current developments around carbon farming and its integration in carbon markets and legistlation in Europe.

In the light of the EU CRCF (Carbon Removal Certification Framework) framework, sessions were organized around management practices, standards and certification mechanisms, and MRV technologies.

The international "4 per 1000" Initiative, together with the Soil Carbon International Research Consortium (Soil Carbon IRC) hosted a session on Paving the way for cohesive action on soil carbon sequestration: The role of International Initiatives in the development of MRV frameworks that meet European Carbon Farming challenges. The session highlighted the increasing recognition of healthy and carbon rich soils as a central lever to the three Rio Conventions and reflected on the achievements of the "4 per 1000" Initiative during the last ten years. It stressed the Initiative's role as a major actor increasing the awareness of the role of healthy carbon rich soils for climate and food security in politics and society, and faciliting dialogue and collaboration beyond stakeholder groups. The session presented the Soil Carbon IRC as an international science-driven, third-party network and introduced the "4 per 1000" inventory of MRV tools and systems as well as the IRC's cookbook for assessment in different MRV contexts as two prominent examples for stakeholder support on MRV offered by the two

With over 100 people in the room and 50 online participants, the session was well received. The recording can be accessed here. A comprehensive report of the summit including recommendations to the EU Commission will be published by the organizers during the next weeks.

1/ Dr. Beata Madari, could you introduce yourself in a few words?

I am an agronomist, formed in Hungary. My Ph.D. I obtained from the Gödöllö University of Agricultural Sciences in Hungary with sandwich studies at Purdue University, Indiana, USA. Since 2000 I've been living in Brazil and since 2002 working at the Brazilian Agricultural Research Corporation, first at its National Soil Research Center, Embrapa Soils, and later I moved to the Rice and Beans Research Center, Embrapa Rice and Beans. I am specialised in soil science and sustainable agricultural systems, studying soil organic matter, soil C sequestration, GHG emissions and C balance.

2/ As Scientist at the Embrapa National Research Center for Rice and Beans (Brazil), what are the main actions you take in connection with the international "4 per 1000" Initiative: Soils for Food Security and Climate'?

As part of the Scientific and Technical Committee (STC) of the "4 per 1000" Initiative I do my best to contribute to its activities that support the Initiative to spread up-to-date scientific knowledge on the role of soils, the ultimate natural resource besides water and biodiversity, in supporting food security in a changing climate; but also on how to care for the soil so that it actually can fulfill its functions we need and depend on for future resilient agricultural systems, communities and economies. Today it is important to be able to grab the global context and connections, but it is vital that we can see our own local or regional diversity and challenges and address them in the global context.

I am lucky and grateful for the opportunity I had joining the STC, because it allows me to do exactly that with the contribution and views of colleagues from different parts of the world. I would like to be able to do more to help regional collaboration, first of all on the scientific level, which is my closest and more familiar professional environment. However, with the help of the other stakeholders who are working in the agriculture value chain, we should be able to go beyond and help solutions in the practice with direct results on the farms, independently on their size or ownership. With the upcoming event, the Latin American and Caribbean Soil Carbon Research Symposium in Rio de Janeiro, 25th to 28th of June of 2025, I hope we will be able to bring useful information for all stakeholders and a useful forum for interaction among them.

3/ What does the international "4 per 1000" Initiative represent for you?

The "4 per 1000" Initiative is the first global initiative that considers agriculture and agricultural soils not only as a problem for the environment and climate, but as part of the solution, a positive attitude toward agriculture and what it represents: food, energy, fiber, commodities and environmental services. It is not a scientific initiative, but the solutions it promotes and represents are based on scientific evidence. It may be the only widely known and respected initiative that is able to reach out to and bring together a wide range of stakeholders, being the catalizator of concrete, on the ground actions to enhance sustainability in agriculture.

4/ What message do you want to convey to the "4 per 1000" Partners and Members?

I want to enphasize the importante of positive connections among the different stakeholders of the agricultural value chain, and bring up the fact, which I am sure they all know, that the individual and collective success of all of it, at the end, depends on the health of our soils. Any and all action in agriculture must consider soil. At least if we think in the long-term, which is an inherent way of thinking of those who work with nature.

105 winners of the "Supporting Farmers in the context of Climate Change" call for projects: more than 10,000 farmers will be supported in their climate transition

As part of the "Supporting Farmers in the context of Climate Change" call for projects launched in 2024 by the French Ministry of Agriculture and Food Sovereignty and ADEME, 105 projects were selected by the regional selection committees for a combined grant amount of €21.8 million.

An effective and impactful project: Restoring livelihoods in wartorn Tigray

In the wake of the devastating two-year war that ravaged Ethiopia's Tigray region from November 2020 to November 2024, thousands of farmers—particularly women—were left struggling to rebuild their lives. The scars of conflict ran deep, but resilience and hope remained. Recognizing the situation's urgency, the Development Alliance (DA), in partnership with the Center for International Forestry Research and World Agroforestry (CIFOR-ICRAF), launched a project in May 2024.

Funded by the Czech Republic Ministry of Foreign Affairs through Czech Development Cooperation, the initiative "Stabilization of selected waraffected areas in Tigray Region by ensuring food nutrition security for vulnerable population groups and creating employment opportunities for youth residences" aimed to restore food and nutrition security while creating employment opportunities for the region's youth.

The project focused on two districts—Tsirae-Womberta and Enderta—and directly benefited over 300 families through diversified agricultural activities, including high-value fruit tree cultivation, vegetable farming, beekeeping, poultry rearing, and nursery establishment.

1st Mediterranean Agroecology Congress - 9-12 June 2025 - Agrigente (Sicily), Italy

The 1st Mediterranean Agroecology Congress represents an important opportunity for dialogue among farmers, researchers, and actors in the agroecological sector from across the Mediterranean basin. Special attention will be given to the interaction between sciences, practices, and movements, with three thematic days on the topic (June 9, 10, and 12) and a special day of farm visits (June 11), during which farmers will directly illustrate their practices and results in the field.

Through a participatory process and round tables, guidelines and directives will be defined for the following areas:

- Scientific: to guide research towards the real needs of agroecology in the Mediterranean
- Technical: to promote innovative solutions and practices applicable to Mediterranean agricultural realities
- Political: to offer guidelines and proposals for public policies aimed at the development of agroecology.

RECSOIL: Driving sustainable soil management and climate action in Costa Rica

The RECSOIL initiative, led by the Global Soil Partnership (GSP) of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), is making significant strides in advancing soil health and mitigating climate change. Focused on soil organic carbon (SOC) sequestration, the programme positions Costa Rica as a key leader in this global effort, with active participation from stakeholders such as the Dos Pinos Farmer Cooperative, ICAFE (Instituto del Café de Costa Rica), FONAFIFO (Fondo Nacional de Financiamiento Forestal), INTA (Instituto Nacional de Tecnología Agropecuaria), UCR (Universidad de Costa Rica), UNA (Universidad Nacional), UNDP (United Nations Development Programme), and MAG (Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock). The engagement of dairy and coffee farmers highlights the collective commitment to transforming agricultural practices to improve soil health and help mitigate climate change. More information here.

The economic benefits of sustainable soil management: a new FAO resource for Eurasian countries

As part of its support to the transformation of agrifood systems, FAO and its Global Soil Partnership (GSP) has released the brochure "Economic Benefits of Sustainable Soil Management". This document reviews existing literature and data, and highlights the essential role of sustainable soil management (SSM) in strengthening economic resilience, agricultural sustainability, and enhancing food security across Eurasia.

The CGIAR Initiative on Agroecology

<u>The CGIAR Initiative on Agroecology</u> is a transdisciplinary, participatory, and action-oriented approach aimed at enhancing food system resilience, equity, and sustainability.

This Initiative aims to develop and scale agroecological innovations with small-scale farmers and other agricultural and food system actors across different socio-ecological contexts in seven low- and middle-income countries.

With 75 partners and over 11,000 food system actors across seven countries, CGIAR has co-developed methods, tools, and solutions that accelerate agroecological transitions-delivering tangible results.

Promising carbon storage in agroforestry systems on the east coast of Madagascar

UA study conducted as part of CIRAD's BiodivClo project has made it possible to accurately measure carbon stocks and better understand wood uses in clove-based agroforestry systems on the east coast of Madagascar. The results highlight the diversity of carbon storage capacities depending on species use and management in agroforestry systems. It was revealed that these systems can store up to 19 tons of carbon per hectare and that some species can store up to 110 kilograms of carbon per tree. Most of the carbon sequestered on land is stored in soil and water

An international study, with the participation of INRAE and the CEA, has discovered that the majority of terrestrial carbon sequestered over the last 30 years is stored in nonliving forms such as the bottom of lakes and rivers, wetlands and soils. Until now, forests were considered to be the main carbon sinks on terrestrial surfaces. However, an analysis of carbon fluxes over the last few decades reveals that, if we take into account gains and losses on a global scale, only around 6% of the total sequestered carbon is stored in live biomass. This loss could be the result of forest degradation in many parts of the world—caused by fires, droughts and deforestation. Very little is known about the key sequestration processes in these nonliving pools, and currently, many are not included in global models of changes in carbon stocks. Published on 20 March 2025 in Science, these results could help to better predict the future trajectory of these reservoirs and how they are affected by human activities and climate change.
